Building internal capacity and ensuring that the teaching of PE is high quality, children are challenged and lessons are inclusive should be a priority.

A detailed scrutiny will result in an action plan to improve PE throughout the school. This should include lesson observations, interviews with teachers and pupils and an inspection of planning, assessment and policies to highlight areas of strength and those in need of development.

Priority:

To improve the quality and breadth of PE, Sporting Provision and Play by ensuring effective use of the primary school sport funding to impact positively on pupils' lifestyles and physical & mental wellbeing

Success criteria:

- Participation rates in games, dance, gymnastics, swimming, athletics increase
- increased participation in school sports competitions (inter-school)
- increased success in competitive sports
- fully inclusive PE curriculum
- increased range of provisional and alternative sporting activities
- greater involvement with other schools and local partners
- improved links with other subjects and with SSMC and PSHCE
