## Message from the Headteacher

I wanted to take this opportunity to let you all know how incredibly privileged and proud I am to have been appointed as Headteacher at Upton St Leonards C of E Primary School and tell you a little more about myself for those of you that don't know.



I live in the local community with my partner Mark and our three boys, Oliver (11), Joshua (10) and Harvie (7); two of which attend our next closest Primary School. The fact that my own children are growing up in our community, makes my vested interest in the quality of provision for our next generation even greater.

I have been a Teacher and Senior Leader in schools for 13 years within Worcestershire and Gloucestershire. In that time I have been a Senior Leader in a very small school, a large school and across a Multi Academy Trust. My most recent posts have been in the Senior Management Team as Inclusion Lead and Deputy Headteacher here at our school.

I feel very lucky to have the opportunity to take over the leadership of a school which I love, but also has such a good reputation within the community. I am sure some parents are understandably nervous about the recent changes in personnel. Having children myself, I know how change can affect how you feel about a school. I hope that my appointment will now put the community at ease, knowing we can move forward with certainty and clarity.

The school remains a good school and the expectations of all staff, teaching and non-teaching, will be as high as they were before. Over time you may notice small changes as we strive for continual school improvement but these will be communicated to you in advance with clear reasoning given. At times, we may also consult with you, as key stakeholders, before making the changes.

As the leader of the school, my main job is to make sure your child is safe, happy and achieving well. I believe children should feel welcome, inspired, safe and supported when they are learning. They will achieve well if they are clear about what is expected of them and the steps they need to get there.

Upton St Leonards C of E Primary School may be a good school but it has the potential to be excellent. It is the aim of the whole school team to help each child become a successful learner and well-rounded individual who is ready to make the next steps in their learning journey.

I am keen to give parents the opportunity to say hello and also ask any questions you may have of me. I therefore would like to offer an informal meeting for parents and carers on Friday 13th March at 3:30pm. There will be a short presentation followed by tea and coffee and the opportunity to ask any questions you may have of my senior leaders and I.

## Our new Hub

Due to the recent purchase of laptops to be used in classes, the opportunity to move our nurture room, 'The Hub', to a more central place arose. This means that the Hub is now more at the heart of the school where the 'old' computing room was. As we are a 'Embracing Thrive' school, The Hub has been redesigned with this in mind. We have; sensory lighting, opportunities for exploring water/messy play, a creative area, an area to explore our identity, an area to explore sensory mats/stones, a sand play area, a Lego area, a reflection and quiet space, several areas of containment and a listening centre. These have all been created with the natural outdoors in mind, using astro turf, plants, trees and wood. This has allowed us to create a space where the children feel free to explore, be safe, have a sense of belonging and of course have the feeling of being loved and valued. We are extremely lucky to have such a creative, calm and relaxing room and it is an imperative asset to our Inclusion Team.
